South Norfolk Local Plan Documents

Site Specific Allocations and Policies Document

This document designates areas of land in sustainable locations for new housing, employment, recreation, open space and new community building such as schools. It will provide for high quality new homes for now and future generations, attract new businesses and enable existing businesses to expand setting out important policies for the delivery development and infrastructure needed to expand and enhance towns and villages of South Norfolk to 2026.

Development Management Policies Document

This document will determine how the Council carries out its development management responsibilities to promote sustainable development and how it will determine all planning applications. The policies influence the type and quality of future homes and other new development that is approved by the Council, and will help us conserve heritage assets and the countryside for future generations to enjoy, while delivering the ambitious spatial planning strategy and objectives for the growth of the area (which are set out in the Joint Core Strategy).

Wymondham Area Action Plan

This plan provides for the growth of Wymondham of at least 2,200 new houses, 20 hectares of employment land and improved services and facilities including expansion of the town centre, enhanced public transport and new education provision. The Area Action







Plan has a defined boundary and balances the growth of the historic market town with protecting and enhancing a Kett's Country Landscape' to strengthen the role of the Tiffey Valley, maintain the open land between Wymondham and Hethersett, conserve the landscape setting of the town and abbey and create connections and linkages between green infrastructure.
