



Refurbishment Grants

The Village Hall has recently been awarded two grants: £13,625 from the Community Fund (formerly the National Lottery Charities Board) and £4,194 from the Norfolk Rural



Community Council. The Community Fund grant, together with an existing grant from South Norfolk Council, will enable the Hall to be rewired, have a new suspended ceiling with insulation and be redecorated. This will complete Phase 1.

Due to new legislation scheduled for 2004 the Village Hall will be required to fit facilities for the disabled (this is part of Phase 2). The recent award from the Norfolk Rural Community Council will provide for this.

Refurbishment work on the Village Hall is currently underway and the Hall will be reopening in mid September 2002.
