

The Open Evening went well and plenty of good food and wine was consumed.




Bunwell Road Footpath

Norfolk County Council has put out for consultation to Wymondham Town Council a proposal to build a footway along part of Bunwell Road from The Boars Public House to just past Beck House. This will be phase one of a possible two-phase scheme. The start date of the phase one proposal is January 2003.

Norfolk County Council are currently investigating the possibility of extending the footway further to Hill Road as a second phase.
