Speed Limit

New speed limits are soon to be introduced to Spooner Row. Norfolk County Council propose to reduce the current 40mph zones in some areas to 30mph with a view to reducing this to 20mph. outside the school.

New look for the Spooner Row signal box!

The Spooner Row Signal Box has recently undergone a make-over and featured on BBC Look East and in the Local Press! It was re-painted in its original colours.

The Signal Box was built in the 1880's and is a Great Eastern Railway (GER) type 2. It still retains a semaphore signalling system and the gates are operated manually.

The original station building was built in 1844 and was demolished after a fire in 1977.
