VILLAGE HALL REFURBISHMENT

The initial work to refurbish the village hall has now been completed. The village hall floor has been repaired and the builder (A. J. Dunning) has made a splendid job. In fact, during the six weeks of building work things ran fairly smoothly. Over half the floor area (including the kitchen and under the stage) has been mended. Although it visibly appears that little has changed, major repairs have been undertaken out of sight to the floor supports. The woodworm we didn't know were there, aren't there anymore—they've been blasted by chemicals!

There were some interesting objects found under the boards (particularly in the area at the far end of the hall nearest the railway line), including many old food tins and bottles (some probably pre World War II), a corked vial of poison with some yellow liquid still inside and a very old child's boot (possibly early Victorian). Information on these pieces may be provided by Norwich Castle Museum. We also placed our own time capsule under the floor for a future generation to find.

A new heating system (including a new boiler) has been installed. There are now radiators throughout the entire village hall and it is certainly a lot quieter and warmer than the previous, antiquated heating system!

The new heating system and floor repairs have cost about £20,000. This was mainly funded by grants from the following: National Lottery Awards for All (£5,000), Wymondham Town Council (£3,000), South Norfolk District Council (25% of costs up to £11,799) and Norfolk Rural Community Council (who administer funds for Norfolk County Council, £2,067). The refurbishment is about half way through and the village hall committee are now seeking additional funds to continue. Future work includes rewiring the hall, a new ceiling, redecoration and other minor repairs.

As a charity, the village hall committee has always had to rely on securing its own funding. This is solely achieved by income raised from hiring the hall, fund raising events and the occasional donation. Recently the committee has been fortunate in receiving several grant awards and other grant applications are in the pipeline. Donations are always welcome and the village hall is registered for Gift Aid, which will boost the value of a donation made by tax paying individuals. Donation forms are available on request from the Secretary.

BINGO NEWS

The Weekly Cash Bingo is still running and the jackpot currently stands at £100. All new and old faces are very welcome. The fun starts at 8 pm every Monday evening. Tea and coffee are available along with the usual cold drinks

and sweets. There is a raffle, Super Bingo Tickets and the chance to win a guaranteed prize of £15 every week in our Lucky House Game. See local press for weekly winners. We are currently running our Christmas Squares Board with lots of Christmas goodies for prizes. The Christmas Bingo is not far off, on Monday 10th December. GOOD COMPANIONS




